## SAVE YOUR PET'S LIFE

Your pet may know where it lives, and how to get home if it wanders, but what if it becomes lost? Does your pet have some sort of identification so that it will be returned to you? Unfortunately, lost pets without any identification end up as statistics at animal shelters.

The Montreal S.P.C.A. estimates that over 60,000 lost pets are brought in yearly, and only 6,000 of these are claimed by their owners. This means that over 54,000 pets are either adopted or euthanized each year. Don't let this happen to your pet.

An identification tag on the pet's collar is necessary. If your pet's collar should be off, a permanent identification method is its only hope. A **MICROCHIP** is a small implant, given like a vaccine, which will identify your pet for life. All of the pet-related industries are strongly recommending this simple method of permanent identification.

Losing a pet is a traumatic experience for families. If you lose your pet, start looking for it immediately. If you cannot find your pet, call your local animal shelter. Ask your city hall where your local shelter is. Try these 3: Montreal S.P.C.A. 735-2711; Berger Blanc 494-2002; Langill Kennel 631-8704.

Don't take a chance with the one you love. Make sure your pet is wearing an identification tag, and has a permanent identification microchip so it will be properly identified. Give your pet every chance to come home again.
